Who we are

Significant numbers of people using the general hospital will have mental health needs in addition to the physical disorder that prompted their original referral or admission. To meet these needs, the Liaison Psychiatry Team can offer:

- Assessment of mental health needs.
- Short term treatment and support whilst you are in hospital.
- Referral to relevant services
- Support and advice to carers

How we do this:

We offer a supportive and caring service for people with mental health needs who are staying in the general hospital.

A member of your medical team will discuss a referral with you. If you agree to this, a member of the team will come to see you and make an assessment of your needs.

This assessment will involve you talking to a member of the team about your situation. The meeting will take place privately.

Our aim is to work in partnership with you to find ways to help.
